Billing Information: Water, Ridgeland sewer, Jackson sewer, garbage and recycling are included in your water bill. The water bill is mailed by the 1st of the month. The due date is the 16th of the month before 5 p.m. Payment may be made in person, by bank draft, by mail, or deposited in the drop box located outside the front entrance to City Hall. Payment may also be paid online at the website above or by calling 1-888-284-9025 for a fee of \$2.00 plus 3% of your bill (only 3% if paid at city hall by credit card). Manage your account online where you may utilize quick pay, schedule payments or enroll in auto pay. You may receive your water bill by mail or email. Please do not hesitate to contact us at utilitybilling@ridgelandms.org if you have any questions.

Online Services: Through the City's website, you may pay your water bill, submit requests for action by the City for code enforcement, animal control, roadway concerns, street light maintenance and more, sign up for Ridgeland Alert, view official meeting minutes, obtain copies of an accident report, pay a traffic ticket, and view government auction items. Check out the City Calendar on the website to stay up-to-date on Ridgeland Recreation and Parks events, holiday schedules, and meetings. Important Ridgeland Laws

You may wish to review the following local ordinances and laws online at www.ridgelandms.org.

Animal Control Ordinances A breed ban is in effect in Ridgeland for American Pit Bull Terrier, Staffordshire

> Bull Terrier, American Staffordshire Terrier, and Wolf-dog hybrid. No more than three dogs are allowed at any residence. It is unlawful for any animal to run atlarge. Caretakers are to remove animal wastes and dispose in a sanitary way.

Bicycle Helmet Ordinance Helmets must be worn while riding on any street, sidewalk, bikeway, trail or other

public property.

Parking Codes Parking on grass and parking on the street is a violation of city parking

ordinances.

Property Maintenance Ordinance Private property must be maintained to ensure the protection of public health,

safety and welfare. Violations include tall grass, poor conditions of exterior

structure, and accumulation of items visible from the street.

Privilege Licenses All businesses including home-based businesses are required to have a privilege

license from the City of Ridgeland.

Smoking in Public Places Smoking in enclosed public places and all workplaces is prohibited in Ridgeland.

Smoking in outdoor areas must follow distance restrictions.

Solid Waste and Recycling

The City of Ridgeland contracts its garbage and recycling collection with Waste Management, Inc. The city provides your recycling cart, but you will need to provide your own trash container. Waste Management will empty no more than two garbage cans per household per collection day.

Get rewarded for recycling in Ridgeland through Ridgeland Recycling Rewards. Please visit ridgelandrecyclerewards.com to activate your account. Lawn Debris Collection

Waste Management collects yard debris on your first collection day of the week. Waste Management requires that yard debris be bundled or bagged, cut into lengths of no longer than 5 feet, 8 inches in diameter, and not weighing more than 60 pounds. Leaves must be bagged. Limbs and branches must be no larger than an armful. If you have a large amount of yard debris, it may take more than one collection day for it to be completely removed. Please do not sweep grass clippings, leaves and limbs into the storm drains. It could lead to flooding on your street.

The City of Ridgeland Public Works Department uses a knuckle boom truck to collect yard debris that is too large to meet Waste Management's collection guidelines. Lawn debris should be placed within 10 feet of the curb by Monday morning of your collection week. Collection may occur on any day of your collection week, so please have your debris ready for pick up by Monday morning of that week.

Exception: Professionally cut trees, branches and limbs will not be collected by the City of Ridgeland.

Backyard composting is a way to recycle leaves, grass clippings, pruned plant material, and certain food waste. Decomposed organic material can be returned to the garden and landscape, adding beneficial nutrients to the soil and reducing the amount of garbage sent to the landfill.

Large Item Pick-up

Waste Management will pick up large items/appliances that will not fit in your in your garbage can. Please call Waste Management at 601-922-9647 to schedule collection the day before your first pick-up of the week.

Hazardous Wastes

Hazardous wastes such as lawn and household chemicals, tires, batteries, TV's, office equipment and more may be recycled and/or safely disposed during Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day which is held once or twice per year, in the spring and possibly the fall. Check www.ridgelandms.org for the dates, hours and location.

To dispose of hazardous waste throughout the year, go to the Jackson Environmental Service Center located at 1570 University Blvd. They may be contacted at 601-960-1193.

Important Service Information

Beginning October 1, 2024, WM will transition to automated recycling collection. Existing 32 or 64gallon carts can be used.

Service Guidelines

Remember to place your carts at least 3 feet apart and 3 feet away from any obstacles (trees, cars, mailboxes, etc.) to allow the automatic arm to lift and empty the carts. Place the wheels of cart toward the house.





Recycling cart with yellow lid - Please place recyclables directly into your cart and break down cardboard. Do not bag recyclables. No material outside the cart will be collected.



Have your carts at the curb the night before or no later than 6:00 a.m. on your collection day.





The City of Ridgeland's Code Enforcement Division provides the requirements to ensure public health, safety, and welfare of its residents.

The division is designed to help residents identify and correct violations which detract from the appearance of their home, neighborhood and community.

How you can help...

- 1. Keep grass and weeds cut and maintained.
- 2. Park all vehicles in driveway, not in yard.
- Trailers, Boats & ATV's must be parked in a garage, carport or back yard.
- 4. Accumulation should not be visible from street.
- 5. No inoperative or unlicensed motor vehicle shall be parked or stored on any premises.
- 6. The exterior of a structure shall be maintained in good repair.
- All accessory structures (garages, fences and walls) shall be maintained structurally sound and in good repair.
- 8. Accumulation shall not be stored inside a carport to the extent that such storage prevents the use for parking.
- Garbage or refuse containers shall be stored behind the front line
 of the building and shall not be visible from the street, except
 when put out for collection.
- 10. Construction materials, wood fencing and other items not picked up by WM, must be taken to the landfill.
